How to apply

You will need to create a mySRA account [https://www.sra.org.uk/mysra/get-mysra-account/] if you don't already have one.

Before you apply for admission to the roll of solicitors, you must have completed your screening. This is carried out for us by Atlantic Data. Find out how to apply [https://www.sra.org.uk/become-solicitor/admission/screening/] .

There is also an option to complete an early character and suitability assessment [https://www.sra.org.uk/become-solicitor/character-and-suitability/] prior to admission if you think you may have any issues.

Applying for admission

You must have met all the requirements for the route you wish to apply under before you can start your application.

If you are applying through the LPC route, find out what you need to do [https://www.sra.org.uk/become-solicitor/legal-practice-course-route/period-recognised-training/your-period-recognised-training/applying-solicitor-prt/] .

If you are applying through the SQE route, find out what you need to do [https://www.sra.org.uk/become-solicitor/admission/pathways-qualification/] for your pathway to admission.

Once you have your screening results, you can apply for admission in your mySRA account. Please make sure you choose the correct route at the start.

Applying for your first practising certificate

If you carry out reserved legal activities

[https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/guidance/practising-certificate/], you will need a practising certificate. You can apply for your first practising certificate once you have chosen your admission date.

If you had an SQE2 assessment exemption, you must demonstrate your English or Welsh language competence before applying for your practising

Fee

The admission fee is £100. You can pay by credit or debit card.

Our service level

We aim to admit you within 30 days unless there is a character and suitability issue.

There is a separate fee for your first practising certificate.

Registered European lawyers

The admission fee for registered European lawyers (REL) is £500.

We aim to decide on an REL application within four months.
