Introduction

These regulations set out the requirements governing organisations which are providing or intending to provide education and training, and the delivery of assessments to those seeking to be admitted as solicitors.

This introduction does not form part of the SRA Education, Training and Assessment Provider Regulations.

Part 1: Requirements for education providers

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Regulation 1: Education providers

- 1. Only an <u>approved education provider</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#approvededucation-provider]_may provide and assess:
 - 1. a <u>Qualifying Law Degree [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#Qualifying-Law-Degree];</u>
 - 2. a <u>CPE [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#CPE]</u>;
 - 3. an <u>Exempting Law Degree [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#Exempting-Law-Degree]</u>; or
 - 4. an <u>Integrated Course [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#Integrated-Course]</u>.
- Only an <u>authorised education provider</u> [<u>https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#authorised-education-provider]</u> may provide and assess the <u>Legal Practice Course</u> [<u>https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#Legal-Practice-Course]</u> or the Professional Skills Course.
- 3. An organisation may apply to the <u>SRA</u> [<u>https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> in such manner as may be <u>prescribed [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-</u>



regulations/glossary/#prescribed] to be an approved education provider [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#approvededucation-provider] or an authorised education provider [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#authorisededucation-provider].

- 4. The <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> may, in relation to an application for approval or authorisation:
 - 1. grant the application, subject to such conditions and for such period as it considers appropriate; or
 - 2. refuse the application.
- 5. If the <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> considers that an <u>approved education provider</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#approved-education-provider] or an <u>authorised education provider</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#authorised-education-provider] has failed to comply with any obligation placed on it under these regulations, the <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> may:
 - 1. revoke the organisation's approval or authorisation, as appropriate; or
 - 2. make the approval or authorisation subject to such conditions as it considers appropriate.

Part 2: Requirements for authorised training providers

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Regulation 2: Authorised training providers

- Only an <u>authorised training provider</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#authorisedtraining-provider] may provide a period of recognised training [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#period-ofrecognised-training] to trainees [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standardsregulations/glossary/#trainee].
- An organisation may apply for authorisation as an <u>authorised</u> <u>training provider [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-</u> <u>regulations/glossary/#authorised-training-provider]</u> and its application must demonstrate that it will meet the requirements of regulations 3 to 5 below.
- 4. The <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> may, in relation to an application for approval or authorisation:
 - 2. grant the application, subject to such conditions and for such period as it considers appropriate; or
 - 3. refuse the application.



- 5. If the <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> considers that an <u>authorised training_provider</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#authorised-training_provider] or a training_principal [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#training-principal] has failed to comply with any obligation placed on it under these regulations, the <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> may:
 - 2. revoke the organisation's authorisation;
 - 3. make the authorisation subject to such conditions as it considers appropriate; or
 - require the <u>authorised training_provider</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#authorisedtraining-provider] to appoint a new <u>training_principal</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#trainingprincipal].

Regulation 3: Requirements for authorised training providers

- 3. An <u>authorised training provider [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#authorised-training-provider]</u>must:
 - 3. have in place a <u>training principal</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#trainingprincipal] for the whole duration of any <u>period of recognised</u> <u>training [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standardsregulations/glossary/#period-of-recognised-training]</u>, who meets the requirements of regulation 5 and whose identity has been notified to the <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standardsregulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> in the <u>prescribed</u> [<u>https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#prescribed]</u> form; and
 - 4. pay the fees and expenses for each <u>trainee's</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#trainee] first attempt at the Professional Skills Course.

Regulation 4: Requirements for recognised training

- 4. A period of recognised training [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standardsregulations/glossary/#period-of-recognised-training] must:
 - 4. unless regulation 4.2 applies, be of a duration of a total of at least two years full time, or equivalent;
 - 5. ensure that the <u>trainee [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-</u> <u>regulations/glossary/#trainee]</u> has applied and developed the skills as set out in the <u>Practice Skills Standards</u>

- 6. be appropriately supervised by <u>solicitors</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#solicitor] and other individuals who have adequate legal knowledge and experience in the practice area they are supervising and the necessary skills to provide effective supervision; and
- 7. include regular appraisal of the <u>trainee's</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#trainee] performance and development, and review of the <u>trainee's</u> <u>record of training [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standardsregulations/glossary/#record-of-training]</u>.
- 5. An <u>authorised training provider [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-</u> <u>regulations/glossary/#authorised-training-provider]</u> may recognise previous work-based experience the <u>trainee</u>

[https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#trainee] has undertaken as satisfying up to six months of the required <u>period of</u> <u>recognised training [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-</u> <u>regulations/glossary/#period-of-recognised-training]</u>, provided:

- the experience was gained in the three years preceding the commencement of the <u>period of recognised training</u> [<u>https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#period-of-recognised-training]</u>;
- 5. the experience enabled the <u>trainee</u> [<u>https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#trainee]</u>to apply and develop one or more of the skills as set out in the <u>Practice Skills Standards [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#Practice-Skills-Standards]</u>; and
- 6. the <u>trainee [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-</u> <u>regulations/glossary/#trainee]</u> was supervised, and was subject to an appraisal of their performance and development, during the period of work-based experience.

Regulation 5: Training principals

- 5. The <u>training principal [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-</u> regulations/glossary/#training-principal] for an <u>authorised training provider</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#authorisedtraining-provider]_must:
 - 5. be a <u>solicitor [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#solicitor]</u> holding a current practising certificate or be a practising <u>barrister [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#barrister]</u>;
 - 6. notify the <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-</u> regulations/glossary/#SRA] in the <u>prescribed</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#prescribed] form before any individual commences a <u>period of recognised</u>



<u>training [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-</u> <u>regulations/glossary/#period-of-recognised-training]</u> or if this is not possible then as soon as practicable thereafter;

- 7. ensure that the training provided meets the requirements of regulation 4;
- 8. ensure that the <u>trainee [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-</u> <u>regulations/glossary/#trainee]</u> maintains a <u>record of training</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#record-oftraining] which will meet the requirements set out at regulation 3E.1 of the SRA Authorisation of Individuals Regulations; and
- 9. certify to the <u>authorised training_provider</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#authorisedtraining-provider]_in the prescribed [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#prescribed] form at the end of any period of recognised training [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#period-ofrecognised-training]_whether, in their opinion, the trainee [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#trainee].
 - 5. is of the proper <u>character and suitability</u> [<u>https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-</u> regulations/glossary/#character-and-suitability]_to be admitted as a <u>solicitor [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-</u> regulations/glossary/#solicitor]; and
 - 6. has completed training which complies with regulation 4 of these regulations,

and inform the SRA of any previous experience recognised under regulation 4.2.

Only an organisation approved by the <u>SRA</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA] may provide assessments in <u>higher courts</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#higher-courts] civil advocacy and <u>higher courts [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#higher-courts]</u> regulations/glossary/#higher-courts] criminal advocacy conferring a <u>higher</u>



<u>courts advocacy qualification [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#higher-courts-advocacy-qualification]</u>.

- 7. An organisation may apply to the <u>SRA</u> [<u>https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> in such manner as may be <u>prescribed [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#prescribed]</u> to be approved to provide such assessments.
- 8. The <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> may, in relation to an application for approval:
 - 6. grant the application, subject to such conditions as it considers appropriate; or
 - 7. refuse the application.
- 9. The <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> shall issue guidelines and standards for the provision of competence assessments against which the competence of those applying for a <u>higher court advocacy qualification</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#higher-courtsadvocacy-gualification] must be assessed.
- 10. If the <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> considers that an assessment provider has failed to comply with any obligation placed on it under these regulations, the <u>SRA</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA] may:
 - 6. revoke the provider's approval; or
 - 7. make the approval subject to such conditions and for such period as it considers appropriate.

Regulation 6A: Police Station Representative Accreditation Scheme assessment providers

- 6. Only an organisation approved by the <u>SRA</u> [<u>https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> may provide assessments for the Police Station Representative Accreditation Scheme.
- An organisation may apply to the <u>SRA</u> [<u>https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> in such manner as may be <u>prescribed [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standardsregulations/glossary/#prescribed]</u> to be approved to provide such assessments.
- 8. The <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> may, in relation to an application for approval:
 - 6. grant the application, subject to such conditions as it considers appropriate; or
 - 7. refuse the application.
- 9. The <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> shall issue assessment standards against which an assessment



provider must assess the competence of those applying for a police station representative accreditation.

- 10. An assessment provider must provide assessments in accordance with any such guidelines.
- 11. If the <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> considers that an assessment provider has failed to comply with any obligation placed on it under these regulations, the <u>SRA</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#SRA] may:
 - 6. revoke the provider's approval; or
 - 7. make the approval subject to such conditions and for such period as it considers appropriate.

Part 4: Monitoring and inspection

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Regulation 7: Monitoring and inspection

- In order to protect and promote the standards of legal education and training, the <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standardsregulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> may:
 - 7. monitor the relevant programmes of study provided by an <u>approved education provider</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#approved-education-provider] and an <u>authorised education provider</u> [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#authorised-education-provider], the training provided by an <u>authorised training provider [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#authorised-training_provider [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#authorised-training-provider] or the assessments provided by an assessment provider approved under regulation 6;</u>
 - 8. visit the provider's premises, at such intervals and on such grounds as it may consider appropriate;
 - require the provider to respond promptly, fully and accurately to any request by the <u>SRA [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standardsregulations/glossary/#SRA]</u> for explanations, information or documents;
 - 10. require the provider to ensure that relevant information or documents it holds, or that a third party holds on its behalf are available for inspection.

- Any approval, authorisation or recognition granted under the Monitoring of Courses Regulations 1991, the SRA Training Regulations 2011, the SRA Higher Rights of Audience Regulations 2011 or the SRA Training Regulations 2014 - Qualification and Provider Regulations, will continue as if granted under these regulations.
- 9. A <u>period of recognised training [https://www.sra.org.uk/solicitors/standards-regulations/glossary/#period-of-recognised-training]</u> entered into before these regulations come into force will continue to be governed by the SRA Training Regulations 2014 Qualification and Provider Regulations.
