Northern Ireland and Republic of Ireland solicitor

Here are the steps you need to take before applying for admission as a solicitor of England Wales.

Please note Northern Ireland and Republic of Ireland solicitors are exempt from sitting the SQE assessments and qualifying work experience requirements.

Create a mySRA account and add your jurisdictions - do this first

- Tell us you are a Northern Ireland and Republic of Ireland solicitor. You do this in the 'My profile' section under 'Jurisdiction'. Please click 'add jurisdiction', select your professional title, and add the date you qualified.

Background checks and suitability - just before applying for admission

Applying for admission

- You will be asked to upload a copy of a certificate of good standing from all jurisdictions where you hold a legal professional qualification and have been admitted.



- The certificate(s) must be less than three months old (we recommend that the date of issue is no longer than two months on the date you make your application) and confirm:
 - your date of admission
 - that you are in good standing
 - that you have not been subject to any disciplinary proceedings
 - that there are not any pending disciplinary proceedings against you
 - that you are currently entitled to practise.

Applying for a practising certificate - after choosing your admission date

Once you have chosen your admission date, you can apply for a practising certificate.
